However, locating and learning to use these repositories effectively can present major challenges for the researcher. In the morning session, representatives from some of Kentucky's major religious institutions, including the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, will offer insights into the types of records held in their archives. Then, in the afternoon, genealogist and instructor Deborah Lord Campisano will provide a general overview of methodologies and tips for finding family-history information in church records.
